### Items of Note

- -"Lookout" is an Android app that uses computer vision to assist people who are blind or have low vision in gaining information about their surroundings. "Lookout" uses the camera and sensors on your device to recognize objects and text, and then gives you spoken feedback, earcons, and other signals to inform you about what it sees. "Lookout" doesn't speak everything in your view, but looks for important things that you might care about. "Lookout" is designed for extended use (1–2 hours or more). With the camera facing outward, the device can hang from a lanyard around your neck, sit in a shirt pocket, or be held in your hand. To read more, click here.
