White Cane Safety Day is October 15th:

• White Cane Safety Day is Saturday, October 15th. The white cane is an important orientation, navigation and safety tool used by those who are blind or have low vision. The National Federation of the Blind assembled in 1963 and called upon governors of all 50 states to proclaim October 15th of each year in every state as white cane day. Then, on October 6th, 1964, a joint resolution of Congress (HR 753) was signed into law authorizing the President of the United States to proclaim October 15th of each year as "White Cane Safety Day". Within hours of the passage of this congressional joint resolution, then President Lyndon B. Johnson recognized the importance of the white cane.  Beginning Monday, October 10th, the right lane on southbound East 105th Street from Park Lane through the Chester Avenue intersection will be closed for approximately six weeks.

Beginning Monday, October 17... Chester Avenue will be restricted to two lanes eastbound and one lane westbound through East 105th Street for approximately three weeks. Please note all lanes on Carnegie Avenue at East 105th Street will be reopened prior to these new restrictions at Chester Avenue. Click on map to view a larger version.

Reminder...Carnegie Avenue is reduced to one lane in each direction between East 100th Street and Stokes Boulevard through mid-October to allow construction of the new Carnegie eastbound lanes at East 105th Street. Left turns are maintained.

East 105th Street is reduced to one lane in each direction between Carnegie and Euclid Avenues through mid-November for widening work. Access to local businesses is maintained. For more information or to stay informed about future restrictions and changes, visit ODOT's website

Did You Know?

 Clocks turn back an hour at 2:00 a.m. on Sunday, November 6th, marking the end of Daylight Saving Time. Standard time will be used through March 12th, when clocks will "spring" forward an hour to begin Daylight Saving Time.

Standard time is no longer the norm. About two-thirds of the days during the year now operate on Daylight Saving Time. The rules last changed in 2007, the result of the Energy Policy Act of 2005. The change was an effort to reduce energy consumption, <u>according to the</u> <u>National Institute of Standards and Technology</u>. Daylight Saving Time now begins on the second Sunday of March each year and ends on the first Sunday of November. DST has roots tracing to 1918 in the United States, though not all places always observed it. Currently, it is not used in Hawaii and most of Arizona.
