#### The Two Types of Braille:

- Greetings from the Braille Department! Many of you ask what the difference is between "Uncontracted" and "Contracted" braille when you make requests. (Formerly, these were referred to as "Grade 1" and "Grade 2" braille.)
  - **Uncontracted braille** is where each print letter corresponds to a braille cell. This is a longer form of braille, and often is where people start when learning.
  - **Contracted braille** uses shorter forms of words; is like a shorthand version that makes reading easier and faster. It is similar to sign language where there are signs for whole words or concepts instead of finger spelling each letter.

When making a request to the **Braille Department**, please remember to ask the braille reader which version of braille he or she prefers. If the

person has been reading braille for a long time, usually they will want contracted, but it is best not to assume. If you have one document and a mix of the types of braille requested, please put in the notes section how many copies of what kind you need. Any questions, contact Jennifer Dean (216-791-8118).
