CSC Receives Grant from GPD Group:

CSC received a \$20,000 grant from The <u>GPD Group Employees'</u>
 <u>Foundation</u>, a consortium of employees from different companies that formed in 2014 to have a vehicle for giving back. The group's vision is "to make a difference in the lives of children" and their mission is "to encourage the enrichment of the public education experience for K-12 students and to support children with medical and special needs." The grant dollars will support CSC's <u>Early Intervention</u> program.
