 - 1) An introduction to the wonderful world of Braille a tactile system of reading and writing for people who are blind or have low vision.
 - 2) To experience the Perkins Brailler the starting point for assistive technology for Braille students.
 - 3) To provide activities and strategies to stimulate and support your child in this route to literacy.
 - 4) To expose attendees to some of the many types of devices that produce Braille.
