# CSC's Partnership with the Office of the Secretary of State Jon Husted Receives IACA Merit Award:

 The International Association of Commercial Administrators (IACA) recently honored Ohio Secretary of State Jon Husted's Office with the 2017 IACA Merit Award. Ohio was one of only three jurisdictions worldwide chosen for the prestigious award and was recognized for the significant improvements to the Business Services Division Call Center and customer service by partnering with Cleveland Sight Center in January of 2016. Since working with CSC's Call Center, the number of calls handled per month has gone from 8,000 to more than 12,500 with a 95 percent customer satisfaction rate. Extended weeknight and weekend business hours offered, as well as a guaranteed wait time of 30 seconds or less before their call is answered compared to the 50 minutes some customers had to wait before the partnership are some of the highlights of improved customer service. "We needed to improve our customer service and the partnership with Cleveland Sight Center has proven to be a winning combination," Secretary Husted said. "This is a story of how innovation can save tax dollars and enable the disabled to improve their lives and make Ohio an even better place to start a business.
