Annual Meeting of the Board of Trustees:

 The Annual Meeting of the Board of Trustees was held last evening at Corporate College East. In addition, the agency recognized members of the Foresight Society, which was established to honor all individuals who have made the ultimate commitment of a gift through the establishment of a life income planned gift, some other deferred gift, or have made provisions in their estate plans to benefit CSC.

Board Chair Tom Furnas conducted the meeting, which announced the addition of five new members to the Board of Trustees: Suber S. Huang, MD, MBA, Erin C. Ploucha, Bonita (Bonnie) G. Teeuwen, G. Maxwell (Mackey) Toole, and Susan H. Kimberly Turben, PhD. Board Trustee Caroline Oberndorf was given the distinguished honor of Life Trustee for her commitment to the agency, which began in 1952 when she volunteered at CSC while a student at Laurel School. CSC President Larry Benders presented the year in review during his remarks.
