CSC's Call Center Begins New Statewide Central Intake and Referral System:

 On August 1st, Cleveland Sight Center became the state of Ohio's central intake and registration service provider for the "Help Me Grow" program offered by the Ohio Department of Health and the Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities. Earlier this year, the state of Ohio issued a request for proposal asking for bids to provide an important service to families with newborn babies with a developmental disability who are in search of a service within Ohio. CSC won this competitive bid process by offering an innovative model for matching up the needs of parents with appropriate service providers throughout the state. CSC's state-of-the-art Call Center will provide a centralized service for initial inquiries then refer parents to a service provider in their area. CSC's \$2.7 million proposal will cost the state 50% less than previous programs and will provide excellent service to Ohioans across the state in an efficient way. "We are thrilled that Cleveland Sight Center has won this competitive bid to provide this important service to new parents across the state. Once again, our Call Center agents have demonstrated that they are efficient, effective and empathetic as they serve the needs of clients", said Larry Benders, Cleveland Sight Center President.

- Canada's most high-profile organization supporting people with vision loss is turning to technology in a bid to create what it calls the country's most accessible neighborhood. The CNIB formerly known as the Canadian National Institute for the Blind says it's hoping to transform a small midtown stretch of Yonge St. into an area that blind or low-vision people can navigate easily, and also fully engage with independently. The organization has partnered with the Rick Hansen Foundation to acquire beacons that will help blind people locate businesses on the street, then find their way around inside with confidence. The foundation has funded the purchase of 205 of the roughly 14-centimeter beacons that stores and restaurants in the test area can acquire free and program to convey detailed information about the layout of their physical space to a blind person's mobile phone.
