Spellbound 30 is a Fantastic Evening for CSC...\$318,000 Raised!

• Spellbound, CSC's annual fundraising gala, celebrated 30 years on Saturday, September 24th at Landerhaven in Mayfield Heights. The theme of the evening was "Looking Back, Seeing the Future" with a Hollywood feel to the event. The grand ballroom was electrified with a spirit of giving, celebration, and a sense of real impact on the needs of CSC's youngest clients and families who receive services through the Early Intervention program. Thus far, through many wonderful gifts, Spellbound has raised \$318,000 which is the net figure from all sources...one of the best Spellbounds of all-time!!!

Upon arrival at Landerhaven, guests walked the red carpet for photos into the reception atrium and rotunda, which featured a photo booth and silent auction with 25 great items to bid on. Attendees enjoyed a cocktail reception before being seated for dinner in the grand ballroom, which was decorated in silver and navy with silver CSC balloons on every table.

The program began with Board Chair Tom Furnas welcoming all guests and thanking the evening's committee, sponsors, board trustees, staff, and clients. Tom then asked John Lane, CEO and Managing Director of Inglewood Associates, to the podium, where John spoke about the impact and dedication his colleague and Board Trustee John O'Brien has had on those at Inglewood Associates and Cleveland Sight Center. John Lane presented a \$20,000 check to CSC in honor of John O'Brien.

After dinner, the program resumed with a live auction, video, and funda-need highlighting the Early Intervention program. Exciting elements and entertainment were provided by Larry Benders, The Chozen Few Band, a video showcasing the success stories of some past and current clients, a paddle raise, and dancing to close out the evening.

Strengthening Partnerships and Educating the Community:

- On Monday, September 26th, Lisa Cellura and Karen Bain Hiller were joined by Board Trustee Fred Jones and two of his guests, estate attorneys for Ulmer & Berne LLP, for lunch and a tour of the agency.
- On Tuesday September 27th, CSC hosted a site visit from CBTS Technology Solutions for Business and Cincinnati Bell. CBTS was awarded a master contract to provide telecommunication services to state agencies and currently has 40,000 state of Ohio employees using their phone system. The purpose of the visit was to raise awareness about assistive technology, showcase CSC's Call Center, and determine options to integrate CSC's Call Center platform into the CBTS network. The group was joined by CSC Board Chair Tom Furnas.
- Also on Tuesday September 27th, CSC hosted a site visit from InfoCision. Steve Brubaker, InfoCision's Chief of Staff, visited CSC to

get caught up on all the great things going on at the agency and to view the Call Center in action. Steve is one of the Business Leaders for Kevin Miller, Executive Director of Opportunities for Ohioans with Disabilities, and he last visited CSC prior to the renovation when InfoCision donated furniture and computers to help setup the Call Center.

- CSC hosted a tour for 20 people from VSP on Wednesday, September 28th. VSP is the world's largest vision insurance plan with 77 million members. VSP is seeking to hire more people who are blind or visually impaired and was visiting CSC as an in-service for staff and to discuss how CSC could help them achieve their goals.
- Also on Wednesday September 28th, CSC hosted a site visit and inservice for the staff of Cuyahoga Job and Family Services (CJFS). The team that handles the CJFS main intake line (216-987-7000) visited to learn more about the Call Center and to brainstorm ways to serve customers better. CJFS is a customer of CSC on a project titled the Cuyahoga Benefits Application Hotline (CBAH) and the 216-987-7000 number is one of the largest referral sources to the CBAH. This was a great interaction for both the CJFS staff and the CSC associates who work on this particular campaign.
- Anthony Easley presents "Never Give Up, Never Give In" to the Tutajenga Conference at the Westin Cleveland on Friday, which is the parent organization of the Distinguished Gentleman of Spoken Word. This is the state conference for the Distinguished Gentleman of Spoken Word and the audience is at-risk African American and Hispanic youth.
