The following gives examples of questions that are frequently asked by surveyors during interviews with staff. Would **you** be able to answer the questions if asked by a surveyor?

Administrative and Management Staff:

How have you used input from the persons served to modify your services?

Direct Service Staff:

Describe recent meetings and discussions with supervisors or management.

All Staff:

What is your mission?
