-Audible, the Amazon-owned audiobook company, has launched over 100 Audiobooks for free on Alexa. Customers will be able to access these titles for free via the voice assistant. A customer will simply need to rely on voice commands to get Alexa to start reading these books. The audiobooks can be accessed with voice commands such as "Alexa, Read Sherlock Holmes" or say the same thing in Hindi. The user will need to specify the name of the book which should be read out.
