Educating the Community and Strengthening Partnerships:

-Cathy Javorsky (Switchboard Operator) recently met with a reporter from Spectrum News 1 to talk about accessibility including a lack of braille labels on many products. Check out the feature story and video here.

-Nancy Sidell from Ohio Means Jobs (OMJ) visited CSC this week for a tour of the agency and meeting with Alicia Howerton (Strategic Partnerships Manager). OMJ is the state of Ohio's public workforce system with thousands of employees around Ohio. Nancy wanted deeper insights into low-vision/blindness and the services provided at CSC. Nancy and Alicia both serve on the Executive Committee of the Cuyahoga County Advisory Board for persons with disabilities where Nancy is the Vice Chair and Alicia is Secretary.

-Bobbie Szabo (Leisure and Lifestyles Manager), Gabriella Drago (Leisure and Lifestyles Specialist) and Tom Sawyer (Outreach Specialist) represent CSC today in a meeting with Cleveland Playhouse staff to discuss how to help them be more inclusive, specifically to individuals with low vision and blindness.

What's Happening at Cleveland Sight Center:

-Cleveland Sight Center offers rehabilitation training services for clients. Services are individualized to each client's needs through an intake process that helps CSC staff learn about the client's needs, goals and preferences. Available trainings include activities of daily living, computers and devices, orientation and mobility, groups and functional low vision assessments.

Activities of Daily Living:

- Basic food preparation
- Timepieces
- Telephone usage
- Financial record keeping
- Writing tasks
- Braille
- Money identification
- · Personal grooming and cleaning
- Sewing
- Health care management

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Computer and Device Training:

- Keyboarding
- Sending and receiving emails
- Screen magnification software
- JAWS (Job Access with Speech)
- Talking software
- Tablet and smartphone usage

Orientation and Mobility:

- Pre-white cane skills
- Human guide
- Self-protection skills
- White cane skills
- Navigating new or unfamiliar areas and street crossings
- Public transportation
- Indirect assistance in connecting with guide dog provider

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Group Training:

A comprehensive group training is available in the community to individuals 55+ for senior groups, support groups, independent living facilities and assisted living facilities.

- The training is once a week for four weeks. Each training is two hours long and will include:
- Adaptive daily living skills
- Functional low vision
- Human guide techniques
- Help with vision loss adjustment
- Referrals will be made to Orientation & Mobility as needed.

Low Vision Services:

Functional Low Vision Assessments are available to determine the appropriate magnifier, product for glare control and proper use of lighting.

-Students in preschool had fun trying to predict what groundhogs "Buckeye Chuck" and "Punxsutawney Phil" would say about the weather for the next six weeks. They also enjoyed some outdoor time on Tuesday and investigated what causes ice and snow to melt. As they continue their music theme, the class had a visit from Gabriella Drago (Leisure and Lifestyles Specialist) and her guide dog Freesia, showing the children and helping her play songs on a keyboard. Everyone had a chance to play on a metallophone as well. A metallophone is any musical instrument in which the sound-producing body is a piece of metal, consisting of tuned metal bars, tubes, rods, bowls, or plates – which are struck with a mallet to produce the sounds.

Items of Note:

-An artificial intelligence firm recently launched a voice accessible smartphone for visually impaired people. RealSAM Pocket's new OCR feature allows users to take a picture of printed or handwritten text and have it read back to them with high accuracy. The phone's voice controls guide the process, alerting the user to the image being in focus, while also offering the ability to customize the onscreen display to alternative brightness, contrast, and color combinations to improve visibility for those with some vision. -People who are visually impaired could gain the use of a smart new tool designed to make navigating their environment more manageable. Stanford University researchers have created an affordable robotic cane equipped with sensors and artificial intelligence-driven way-finding technology. Researchers equipped the cane with LIDAR sensors, similar to those used in self-driving cars. The sensors detect and measure the distance to obstacles, helping users avoid them sooner than the traditional cane method. To read the full article, click here.
