Ohio Library for the Blind and Physically Disabled COVID-19 Closure

The following announcement comes from Will Reed, OLBPD Manager. All Cleveland Public Library locations, including the Ohio Library for the Blind and Physically Disabled (OLBPD), are closed to the public until further notice as of Friday, March 13th, to prevent the spread of COVID-19. Likewise, the State Library of Ohio will also be closed to the public for at least three weeks beginning Tuesday, March 17th. Please note that no talking books, braille, or equipment will be able to be received or mailed out during this time. If you have a computer, tablet, mobile device, or third-party player with internet capabilities, please visit the <u>BARD website</u> and BARD mobile app, which provides access to talking books and digital braille files. BARD applications will be processed and approved during this closure.
