### Cleveland Sight Center Receives Three-Year Accreditation from CARF:

- CSC has been issued a three-year accreditation for the following programs:
  - Vision Rehabilitation Services: Comprehensive Vision Rehabilitation Services
  - Community Employment Services: Employment Supports
  - Community Employment Services: Job Development
  - Comprehensive Vocational Evaluation Services

The accreditation will extend through December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2021 and marks CSC’s 13<sup>th</sup>-consecutive three-year accreditation, dating back to 1982. This is a great achievement and is a reflection of the dedication and commitment that the entire CSC staff has demonstrated to provide the best possible services to clients, families and the greater Cleveland community. Quoting the accreditation letter received, “This achievement is an indication of your organization’s dedication and commitment to improving the quality of the lives of the persons served. Services, personnel and documentation clearly indicate an established pattern of conformance to standards”.

Special thanks to the internal CARF team of Charlotte Fornal, Marcia Houston, Susie Meles and Judith Weyburne for their leadership throughout this process. Congratulations and thanks to all staff members for their hard work and support in making this a collaborative and successful achievement.

### An Update on the Electronic Medical Records Project:

- The Electronic Medical Records (EMR) project continues to progress forward as the project management team has recently received an updated version of the Compulink software. The team is reviewing the updates, upgrades and integrations and will connect with any impacted areas of the agency prior to implementing the upgrade. The team also continues to work on accessibility and the integration of the two modules of Compulink being used at CSC. The Low Vision Clinic uses a module of Compulink called EyeCare, which has been in use for the last couple years. Children & Young Adult Services, the first department to begin using the new EMR software, and other areas of the agency to be implemented in the near future, uses a slightly different version of Compulink. Going forward, this version of Compulink will be referred to as ClientCare.

### CSC Partners with Westfield Insurance for Done-in-a-Day Volunteer Event Focusing on Job Club:

- Volunteer Services and Employment Services partnered to offer a unique “Done in a Day” volunteer event at CSC on Friday, December 14<sup>th</sup>. During the event, eight volunteers from Westfield Insurance’s Human Resources team provided rich content for 16 attendees, covering topics like reasonable accommodations, available job opportunities and interview techniques. Following the panel, the team also offered mock interviews to participants. Thank you Westfield Volunteers for making this event so impactful and to all CSC staff and volunteers who helped the event run smoothly.

Some notable event outcomes include:

- Westfield’s feedback that the event “presented a real value” for them as a staff. “It helps us understand the applicant pool from a holistic angle” explained volunteer Bob Taylor.
- One attendee is now pursuing the possibility of employment with Westfield, exploring the chance to work with the company as part of the grounds crew.
- Related to another participant, a Westfield staff member reflected that this individual is “quite bright.” As this individual is looking to pursue

employment opportunities within the next year, it is possible that she might further connect with Westfield staff to continue to explore and understand her own personal reasonable accommodations questions.
