Educating and Engaging the Community:

- The Cohen Family Syndrome held their bi-annual conference at Highbrook Lodge from Thursday, June 9th through Sunday, June 12th, marking the group's third visit to CSC's camp in Chardon, OH. The parents attended informational sessions while Highbrook Lodge staff provided programming for their children. Some families resided onsite in cabins and in all, over 110 adults and children attended the conference. From Sue, mom of Beth, "I just wanted to thank you all for the tremendous experience (again!) that we had last weekend at the Cohen Symdrome conference. Beth (and all of the "kids") had a fabulous time with the counselors and it made Bob and I feel so relaxed and grateful that she was well take care of and having so much fun while we were inside. You are a special group of people, and we were lucky to be able to join you again this year."
- Early Intervention Specialist Brenda Lammers presented to the Ashtabula County Board of Developmental Disabilities Directors on Thursday, June 16th. Approximately 25 people attended and a thank you note received after the presentation stated "Just wanted to send a very special 'Thank You' for the presentation. It was great; everyone is still talking about it. I have traveled to other counties for in-services that were not this interesting. We discussed how these 'touch cues and activities' would work with our sighted children as well. Again, thank you, and keep us in mind when you are doing a class or in-service."

through the Employment Collaborative of Cuyahoga County. GE is looking to increase their disability awareness and provide education to individuals with disabilities currently seeking employment. In addition to a panel discussion, GE Human Resource Professionals, Recruiters, and Managers volunteered their time to review resumes and conduct mock interviews. Attendees also learned about employment opportunities within the GE organization. Kanden Tolbert represented Employment Services and supported several CSC clients at the event.
