In June, House Bill 390 was passed whereby Cleveland Sight Center was awarded capital funding to support our mission.

#### CSC Recognized with Business Longevity Award:

 Cleveland Sight Center was recognized at the 2016 Business Longevity Awards on Thursday, August 4<sup>th</sup> at The Silver Grille in Downtown Cleveland. The inaugural Business Longevity Awards, presented by Smart Business Cleveland, recognized organizations with at least 50 years in business that demonstrate their ability to adapt and evolve with changing times. The panel discussion focused on what it takes for organizations to survive and thrive for 75 years or more. CSC was highlighted in the 100-year category. ### Strengthening Partnerships and Educating the Community:

- A group of 16 medical students from Case Western Reserve University medical school visited CSC this week. Each student was paired with a client volunteer for an interview about the client's experiences with the accessibility of medical care and doctors for those with disabilities. These informational interviews are designed to help the students think about patient care overall and caring for those with disabilities when they become doctors.
- CSC's Adult Literacy Program, in partnership with Cuyahoga Community College (Tri-C), begins its fourth year on Monday, August 29<sup>th</sup>. This year's program has seven new students enrolling with many former students returning. This program has branched off in additional

training in the areas of braille education and assistive technology training. These programs work in tangent with one another to enhance the quality of learning for our students. At the start of each academic year, a mandatory orientation is held for students who are to participate in the program. The orientation was held Tuesday, August 2<sup>nd</sup> and also allowed students complete paperwork for Tri-C and learn more about the services that Tri-C can assist. Also, the students began preliminary (pre-assessment) testing to determine academic levels in math, reading, and reading comprehension. Students were also made aware of other opportunities at CSC.
