# **Exploring New Opportunities and Strengthening Partnerships:**

CSC recently applied to become a waiver provider for the Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities. Those with an <a href="Individual Options">Individual Options</a> (IO) Waiver can apply for services such as obtaining aids and appliances, transportation and camp. Services provided through this waiver allow people to stay in their homes and get support rather than living in an Intermediate Care Facility. Thanks to Charlotte Fornal, Debbie Ruffin, Joel Zureick, Susie Meles and Greg McGrath for their work on this opportunity, which will open a new market of people we can serve as well as identify another source of Medicaid funding for the agency.

Over 27 participants and 18 adults from various areas across Ohio attended Camp Hubble Day, sponsored by NASA Glenn Research Center, at CSC on Saturday, April 18<sup>th</sup>. The interactive program for middle school students celebrated the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Hubble Telescope and featured activities with over 10 NASA scientists, engineers and volunteers. Other organizations in attendance included the Ohio Library for the Blind and Physically Disabled and The Cleveland Museum of Natural History, which provided tactile representations of various constellations.
